

## FAQ on Course Enrolment for ICAS courses

### What is course enrolment?

Course enrolment refers to the process of registering or signing up for a specific course or program offered by an ICAS. In the context of ICAS course enrolment entails aspiring candidates registering themselves on the ICAS academic portal to pursue courses in Astrology, Vāstu, Hasta Rekha, and Nādi.

It is a mandatory step for all new admission to the course. As part of the enrolment process, students are required to enrol themselves for the Praveena and Visharada/Acharya levels of their chosen course.

### What are the courses of ICAS requires enrolment?

- Jyotish Praveena
- Jyotish Visharada
- Hasta Rekha Praveena
- Hasta Rekha Visharada
- Vāstu Praveena
- Vāstu Acharya
- Nādi Praveena
- Nādi Visharada
- Nakshatra Praveena
- Nakshatra Visharda

Completion of the course enrolment process is mandatory for individuals who wish to pursue the courses.

### I have finished first Semester of Jyotish Praveena/Jyotish Visharda. Do I have to enrol for second semester?

No. Jyotish Praveena course has 2 semesters. If you have enrolled for the first semester, there is no need for course enrolment for 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester. The same rule applies for Jyotish Visharada also.

### Why should I enrol myself for ICAS courses?

Enrolment for the course is a part of the admission process. Acceptance of your enrolment for the course by the Chapter Chairman completes the admission process.

### What happens if I don't enrol myself for the Course?

Enrolment in the respective ICAS course is a prerequisite for taking any ICAS examination. Students must be enrolled in the course to be eligible to apply for the ICAS examinations.

### What is the last date for course enrolment?

Semester commencing from January – due date for course enrolment is 28<sup>th</sup> February.  
Semester commencing from July - due date for course enrolment is 31st August.

## How to enroll myself for ICAS courses?

The course enrolment is very simple process takes not more than 2 minutes.


**For New Life Member applicants:** Those who are taking Life Membership for the first time, it prompts for the courses the student is intended to take admission. The course enrolment for them is integrated with the Life Membership application form.

### For Existing Life Members:

To enroll yourself for ICAS courses, follow these steps:

1. Log in to your profile on the "ICAS academic portal".
2. Navigate to the 'Courses' section.
3. Click the "Apply Course admission" drop down
4. Fill out the course admission form, which can be found on the page.
5. Submit the completed course admission form.

By following these steps and submitting the course admission form, you will successfully enroll yourself for the ICAS courses of your choice.

## I am planning to join more than one course. What should I do?

If you are planning to join more than one course at ICAS, please follow the steps below:

1. Fill out a separate enrollment form for each course you wish to join.
2. Under the option apply course admission option under "Courses" tab on the ICAS academic portal, fill out the form for your first course and submit it.
3. If you want to enroll in an additional course, you need to fill out the form again for that specific course.
4. To view the courses you have applied for, go to the "My course admission" tab on your profile page of the ICAS academic portal.

*Please note that it is recommended to concurrently apply and pursue only one Jyotisha course (related to astrology) and one non-Jyotisha course to avoid any overlapping examination dates. This will ensure a manageable schedule for your studies and examinations.*

**I have appeared for the Praveena examination and awaiting the results. Can I enrol for Visharada/Acharya?**

If you have appeared for the Praveena examination and are awaiting the results, you are indeed eligible to enroll for the Visharada/Acharya courses. However, it is important to note that if you did not pass any subject in the Praveena examination, you will need to clear the backlog by retaking the respective subject in the subsequent examination.

While you are eligible to take the Visharada/Acharya examination, if the schedule of the Visharada 1st Semester examinations conflicts with the schedule of backlog papers from the Praveena examination, you must prioritize and take the backlog papers instead of the conflicting Visharada paper.

For example, let's say you failed to clear Jyotish Praveena Paper III, making it a backlog paper. If you enroll for the Jyotish Visharada course and appear for the Jyotish Visharada examination, but the examination schedule of Jyotish Praveena Paper III clashes with the date of the Jyotish Visharada Paper III examination, you must take the Jyotish Praveena Paper III exam instead of the Visharada paper.

It's important to note that the results of the Visharada papers will be put on hold until you clear all the backlog papers from the Praveena examinations. Once you have successfully cleared the backlog, the results of the Visharada papers will be released.

**I have enrolled for a particular course and attended the classes. For some reason, I could not complete my study. Now am planning to reattend the classes. Do I have to enrol for course again?**

No. Course enrolment is required only once for a particular course.
